
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Current State of College/School Accreditation



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Spring 2023 Site Visits





- ACPE will conduct domestic site visits in-person in spring 2023

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ACPE Fee Structure



- Current fee structure for accreditation activities reviewed by the
- Fees for colleges/schools will be maintained at current levels for 2023 including 30% reduction in fees if visit is virtual
- CE accreditation fees will remain the same for 2023, however, penalties were reinstated in September 2022
- NOTE: The Board may need to consider imposing additional travel fees to cover unexpected airfare expenses. Staff and volunteer team members are encountering extremely high airfares. **IN**novate

Update from January 2023 ACPE Board Meeting





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January 2023 Board Meeting

- Board reviewed (colleges/schools):
 - 9 comprehensive evaluations for continued accreditations status (ETRs/ARs)
 - 3 focused visit evaluations (ETRs/ARs)
 - 24 verification visit reports
 - 46 Interim Reports
 - 67 Substantive changes
 - 17 Annual Monitoring responses
 - 10 complaints
 - 27 programs with a 10% decrease in annual budget
 - 27 programs with a 10% decrease in annual budget for INnovate



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January 2023 Board Meeting

AACP Resolution from 2022 Annual Meeting



 AACP supports instituting a 1.5 times program-length completion standard as a second option for colleges and schools of pharmacy to meet ACPE accreditation standards for reporting on-time completion



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Extended Pathway



- There is interest from some programs to establish an "extended pathway"
 - Defined as a mechanism whereby the timeframe students are given to complete the academic pharmacy program is extended to a maximum of 1.5 times the standard 4 academic years (6 years maximum)



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Extended Pathway



- Must be a formal pathway with faculty-approved admissions criteria and include an informed decision on the part of the student to join the pathway
 - Note: An approved "Extended Pathway" is NOT an IEP (individualized educational plan) for a struggling student
- Annual Monitoring would be based on the specifics of the pathway (e.g., on-time graduation would be based on the length of the pathway)



Extended Pathway - Process

- Submit a substantive change notification as well as the submission of a comprehensive academic plan (as described in ACPE's policies and procedures) that demonstrates how the program will remain in compliance with all of ACPE's accreditation standards
- A primary goal of the "extended pathway" comprehensive academic plan would be to demonstrate equivalency to the standard that states the length of the PharmD program as being of four academic years or equivalent (key element 10.1)
- The Board will require a focused visit to vet the program's readiness to deliver the extended pathway and care for students



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Admission Interview Clarification





- Individual, solo, applicant interviews must be part of the interview process
- Video recordings and group interviews have their place in the interview process should a program employ these techniques but a solo interview with a single candidate must also be included that is either in-person or technology assisted



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Nontraditional PharmD Programs (NTPD)

- NTPD students must complete the 4 required core rotations with a minimum duration of at least 4 weeks as outlined in Key Elements 13.4 and 13.6
- The program will be required to provide documentation for a collective total of 1440 hours of APPEs that include the 4 core rotations and elective offerings
- If a NTPD student has a rotation waived, a formalized faculty assessment must be used to document achievement of the outcomes of the waived rotation
- All aspects of any program offering a NTPD pathway should be addressed in the program's self-study process and will be reviewed by the onsite evaluation team members during the program's comprehensive evaluation

Public Health Emergency (PHE) and Distance Education



- PHE is expected to end on May 11th
- Department of Education (USDE)—will be phasing out several flexibilities given to accreditors
- At this time, we expect the flexibilities related to distance education to be rescinded 180 days following the date on which the COVID-19 national emergency declaration is rescinded
- ACPE's normal policies will then be in place



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Public Health Emergency (PHE) and Distance Education



- ACPE policies require the following:
 - If distance education is used to deliver more than 25% of the didactic courses, a program will need to submit a *substantive change*
 - If a program plans to deliver 50% or more of the didactic courses via distance education, then a comprehensive academic plan (as described in ACPE's policies and procedures) will also need to be submitted for Board review
 - ACPE requires <u>one-year advance notice</u> for the addition of a distance campus or the implementation of distance/online education (>50%) for an existing college or school.
 - This notification is required to allow ACPE sufficient time to conduct the evaluation needed to ensure readiness and continued compliance with the accreditation standards.

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NAPLEX Scores – 2022 data



- National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (NABP) has posted the North American Pharmacist Licensure Examination (NAPLEX) Passing Rates for 2020-2022 Graduates (https://nabp.pharmacy/wp-content/uploads/2021/03/NAPLEX-Pass-Rates-2022.pdf)
- As a reminder, a program accredited by ACPE is required to post on its website the most recent year's NAPLEX results for first-time takers as found on the NABP website
- • Please remember to update your website with the current 2022 results no later than March $15^{\rm th}$

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Annual Monitoring



- Doctor of Pharmacy programs are monitoring annually:
 - Changes and trends in NAPLEX® Outcomes
 - Changes and Trends in Enrollment
 - On-Time Graduation Rate Monitoring including academic dismissals, withdrawals and delayed progression
 - Financial Resources
 - Job Placement/Gainful Employment (information only USDE expectation)
 - Other outcome parameters of program choosing (information only)



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Annual Monitoring



Criterion	Benchmark	National Average 2021
Total Attrition	≥ 24%	13.1%
Academic Dismissals	≥ 6%	3.1%
Withdrawals*	≥ 6%	3.8%
Delayed Graduations	≥ 15%	6.3%

Note: ACPE's benchmarks have historically been approximately 2x the national average *Withdrawal includes any reason (other than academic dismissal or delayed graduation) for removal the program, including disability or death



Future – Annual Monitoring



- Board is reviewing all annual monitoring criteria
 - Reviewing practices of other programmatic accreditors
 - How defined, prolonged pathways would fit into annual monitoring criteria
- Looking at methods to make reporting more accurate
- Should ACPE define a bright line or benchmark for NAPLEX versus using the 2SD cutoff?
- Develop clearly defined consequences for multiple years of poor performance (i.e., probation or loss of accreditation)
- Working with the Council of Deans to organize a networking session on April 4th to obtain feedback to share with the ACPE Board Nnovate

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AACP Resolution from 2022 Annual Meeting AACP



- AACP supports a two-year ultimate NAPLEX pass rate (the average pass rate of test-takers 2 calendar years from graduation, regardless of number of attempts) as a second option for programs to meet ACPE reporting requirements
- · Will be discussed by the Board during annual monitoring discussion
 - Currently 2-year data is not available from NABP
 - For most programs all-time pass rate is lower than first time attempt
 - Will solicit feedback during networking session



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Standards Revision



- On schedule
- Board working through the revision
 - No information available to share at this time
- January 2024 Draft Standards 2025 will be released for public comment

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CPD Initiatives



- ACPE developed draft criteria for Continuing Professional Development (CPD)
- Criteria were piloted in 2022
- ACPE was informed that credentialling bodies, regulatory agencies, academic centers, residency programs and others are considering implementing CPD
- Goal is to provide a process for pharmacy professionals to meet, maintain and enhance competencies needed in areas relevant to their practices in an intentional, self-directed manner



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CPD Initiatives



- New ACPE staff member tasked with implementation (Logan Murry)
 - Will be developing CPD policies and procedures based on board-approved CPD initiatives
 - Educational webinars and workshops will be conducted summer and fall of 2023
- Implementation of the CPD criteria and credit framework is planned for January 2024

Draft Models for CPD Credit



- CPD integration with an existing CPE structure
 - Provider oversees CPD credit similarly to CPE credits
 - CPE Monitor would process credits and could be used for re-licensure and/or recertification processes
- CPE providers could create CPD structures that allow them to award points for each section of the CPD cycle when a learner participates in a CE experience that includes documentable CPD elements; learner would receive both CE and CPD credit
- Learner Self-Directed Model
 - Provider could issue CPD credit in line with typical professional learning activities such as precepting, dossiers, journal clubs, etc.
 - By completing reflection activities and documentation and a documented plan for next steps of professional development, CPD provider could assess CPD credits for this work


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
Certificate Programs - Update



- ACPE requirement for hours has been decreased from 15 to 8 contact hours – length of certificate program should be determined based on the level of skill required to be achieved (to be implemented in July 2023)
- Certificate program option available in the Provider Web Tool
- Once the activity is conducted and upon completion of the requirements for credit of the Certificate Program, the provider should:
 - Award ACPE CE credit to the pharmacist and/or pharmacy technician for the UANs (modules) completed via CPE Monitor*, AND, if applicable,
 - Award completion of the ACPE Certificate Program (CPN) via CPE Monitor®

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New Terminology – Effective 1/1/23



- $\bullet \ \, \text{International program terminology change}$
 - From "certification" to "international-accreditation" (International Pre-Accreditation," and "Provisional International-Accreditation")
 - All programs have been notified that the new designation does <u>not</u> imply or confer eligibility to graduates of a program with such status to apply directly to sit for the NAPLEX exam for licensure in the United States
 - Safeguards in place include website disclosure, student acknowledgment, etc.
