

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#### Overview of Accreditation



- Institutional or programmatic (e.g. pharmacy) in nature
- Each accrediting agency sets its own standards
- Standards are developed and institutions are assessed in a <u>peer review</u> process

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#### Accreditation in Pharmacy





- Public recognition accorded by a reliable authority to professional education programs or continuing education providers judged to meet established qualifications and educational standards
- Determined on the basis of initial and periodic evaluation



#### Standards 2025 - Process



- The Standards 2025 Subcommittee of the ACPE Board had multiple meetings during 2022-2023.
- All comments received via the online survey, meetings, and email were discussed as part of the standards revision process.
- The subcommittee reviewed additional comments submitted by other Board members.

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#### **Revision Survey Results**



- 137 submissions on survey plus email messages
- All input was reviewed and categorized
- Lots of suggestions for additions to the curriculum
- No specific comments on what to delete from curriculum, a few generalities....
  - A few suggestions for Standards that should be deleted
- Also solicited feedback from live sessions

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#### Standards Revision 2025 (continued)

- July 2021
  - Held virtual public hearing at the AACP Annual Meeting
  - Virtual meeting with State Board of Pharmacy Executives during monthly NABP call
- September 2021: Met with APhA Board of Trustees
- November 2021: Town Hall meetings with ACCP, AMCP, APhA, ASCP, ASHP, BPS, NABP, NCPA



#### Standards Revision 2025 (continued)



- June 2022: ACPE Board was briefed on Key Findings from the Public Comments and Hearings
- Reviewed key changes in the AACP Curriculum Outcomes and Entrustable Professional Activities document (COEPA)
- Sought Board's guidance to subcommittee on key directions emerging from the public comments and revised COEPA document

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### Standards Revision 2025 (continued)



- July 2022-December 2023
- Prepared revised Standards for all sections
  - Rubric revised
    - Standards 2016: 151 uploads
      - Revision for Standards 2016: 121 uploads
      - Revision for Standards 2025: 66 uploads and 10 data tables

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### Standards 2025 – Major Changes



- •The number of Standards has been reduced from 25 to 7 standards
- •Guidance document statements have been incorporated into the Standards document to provide necessary information in one document
- •References have been made to the Annual Monitoring policies that are also found in the Policies & Procedures Manual

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## Standards 2025 - Major Changes



- •Standard 1: Organization and Governance
  - Key elements from Standards 2016 have been combined or deleted to decrease requirements and focus on necessary elements
  - ■2016 key elements for Vision, Mission, and Goals have been decreased to provide more focus
  - System failures has been renamed to Contingency Planning



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## Standards 2025 – Major Changes



- •Standard 2 Curriculum
  - The CAPE outcomes have been updated to the new COEPA outcomes
  - EPAs will be a separate key element to allow programs who have developed their own EPAs to continue to use them rather than use the EPAs outlined in COEPA
  - Through combination of multiple 2016 standards, duplication was eliminated
  - Key elements have been defined for curriculum design, delivery and oversight to allow for increased specificity



# Standards 2025 – Major Changes



- •Standard 2: Curriculum (continued)
  - Additional specificity has been provided for the "Electives" key element
  - Additional language has been added to support distance learning
  - The didactic IPE requirement for physicians and their students has been removed
  - The IPEC competencies are specifically referenced



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#### Standards 2025 – Major Changes



- Standard 3: Experiential Learning
  - Duplication has been eliminated
  - Guidance document language has been added to the standards and key elements
  - Information for NTPD programs has been added to the standards and key elements
  - Simulation will not be allowed to fulfill IPPE hours
  - Experiential hours have been more specifically defined
  - Experiential management and personnel have a separate section



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#### Standards 2025 - Major Changes



- •Standard 4: Student Services
  - Wellness and well-being has been added as a key element
  - Inclusion of hybrid/online pathways has been added
  - Non-Traditional (Post-Baccalaureate) Doctor of Pharmacy Programs was added an additional key element
  - Additional information on the interview process was added
  - Additional information was added on credit for advanced standing



#### Standards 2025 – Major Changes



- Standard 5: Faculty and Staff
  - Faculty to student ratio was added to the Standards from the guidance document
  - Addition of Academic Credentials for Faculty and Professional Credentials for Staff
  - Scholarly productivity was changed to Scholarly Engagement
  - Online education was added to distance education
  - Faculty and staff wellness and well-being was added as a key element



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## Standards 2025 - Major Changes



- Standard 6: Resources
  - Additional language was added for appropriate resources needed for remote/online delivery
  - Librarian expertise was combined with educational resource access
  - ■Budget adequacy was added as a key element
  - ■Tuition and fees were replaced with Educational Costs



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#### Standards 2025 – Major Changes



- •Standard 7: Assessment
  - A key element was added for an Assessment Plan
  - Assessment has been separated into major assessment areas for each standard
  - Assessment of progression has been added as a key element
  - Faculty workload has been added as a key element
  - Additional key elements related to continuous quality improvement have been added



# Standards 2025 – Major Changes

- Appendix 1
  - Additional wording was added to reflect provider status (diagnosing and prescribing)
  - •Some topics were separated for increased emphasis



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#### Standards Revision 2025



- •June 2024:
- Board reviews feedback, makes necessary changes and approves the document, to be known as "Standards 2025"
- Standards 2025 released following Board Meeting in July 2024 with implementation July 1, 2025
   Allows 12 Anoths between release of new standards and their
- Standards 2025 will be used to evaluate programs undergoing accreditation after July 2025
- New Rubric to support "Standards 2025" released
- New self-study reporting system released
